You are hereby summoned to attend the Annual Meeting of **BARRY TOWN COUNCIL** to be held on Monday, 9 May 2011 at 7.00pm, in the Memorial Hall and Theatre, Barry, and on Tuesday, 10 May 2011 in the Council Chamber, Town Council Offices, 7 Gladstone Road, Barry, at 7.00pm for the purpose of transacting the business shown in the agenda (previously circulated) plus the further business listed below in the Supplementary Agenda. This includes a motion submitted in the names of Councillors Egan and Stenstrom, as well as those items marked "To Follow" within the agenda despatched to you on 21 April.

In addition, the Leader of the Council has requested that the order of the Council's business set out within the agenda for 9 May be varied, by moving the item relating to the Receipt of Declarations of Interest under the Council's Code of Conduct from Agenda Item 11 to Item 7, with those items previously numbered 7, 8, 9 and 10 being renumbered 8, 9, 10 and 11. The remaining business from agenda item 12 onwards, as well as that to be transacted at the Council's reconvened meeting on Tuesday, 10 May, is not affected.

27. To receive and note the minutes of the Planning Committee's Meeting held on 3 May 2011 and to consider any recommendations contained therein **(Pages 1491-1498)**
- 28A. Motion submitted in accordance with Standing Order 20 by Councillors Egan and Stenstrom

“Barry Town Council reaffirms the decision taken by its Planning Committee on 23 January 2007 when it agreed that the former allotment land located to the east of Cemetery Road should be designated for future cemetery use within the emerging Vale of Glamorgan Local Development Plan and that this should be submitted as a candidate site to the Local Planning Authority for inclusion with the LDP 2011/2026 for this purpose. Barry Town Council has previously indicated that it would be inappropriate for either of the open spaces bisected by Cemetery Road to be used for housing or similar purposes, but it would be appropriate for the site to the east of this road to be allocated in the LDP for future cemetery use, thereby enabling the Local Burial Authority to continue to provide this essential service, once the final existing extensions to Merthyr Cemetery are full, as well as helping to maintain the ambience and serenity of the cemetery access road.

The Town Council has previously submitted outline proposals for maintaining this site for the benefit of the local community, in ways that would be compatible with the adjacent cemetery, thereby conserving the open space for the quiet enjoyment of future generations. Barry Town Council therefore calls upon the Vale of Glamorgan County Borough Council to commence meaningful discussions concerning this site so that Barry Town Council might soon be given responsibility for maintaining it, via the provisions of the Unitary Council’s Charter with Town and Community Councils within the Vale of Glamorgan, or by any other mutually acceptable arrangements between the Councils. Furthermore, the Council instructs the Planning Committee to revisit all six candidate sites submitted as part of the LDP consultation process, to ascertain the current situation relating to each site in the light of reports that most of them are likely to be designated for housing purposes, against the Town Council’s wishes.”
