The Mayor advised that she had attended the Cardiff and Vale Youth Orchestra, a vintage fair at the Goodsheds, Ty Hafan Fun Day, Town Council's Family Fun Day, volunteered at the Barry Island 10k, a Pukka in the Park performance, a Ukrainian Independence Day event, GlastonBarry Juniors, Big Barry Quiz, was a judge at the Barry Rotary Club Family Fun Fay & Dog Show and attended the RNLI Summer Ball.

They Mayor also noted that she had held 3 'Mayor on the Move' events and has partnered up with Bro Coffi to be present during these. The Mayor was also invited to the Merchant Navy Memorial at Trinity Square in London in which she laid a wreath at the event. The Mayor also advised that she had attended a celebration for 10 years of the Welsh Coastal Path, the Proclamation of the King and a candlelight service for the passing of the Queen.

The Mayor also noted that there was a lack of participation from councillors at corporate events and asked members to engage more with the public by attending and supporting Council events.

Councillor N Hodges presented the Mayor with a signed book written by Martin Shipman about Gareth Jones.

The Chief Officer read out comments received by email from members of the public.

Councillor S Hodges suggested that the item is deferred to a Consultation Working Party inviting members of the public to attend.

Councillor Brooks also agreed to defer the item to a meeting of the Consultations Working Party, asking if the historically commissioned Capita Reports can be re-distributed to members as new Councillors have joined the Council. Councillor Brooks also asked if the Planning Officer would be able to advise on this appeal. The Chief Officer advised that the Planning Officer had been contacted, however it was felt that this appeal was too technical and out of their remit to comment on.

The Chief Officer asked members if they were happy to temporarily amend the Terms of Reference for this meeting only to allow public access as Consultations Working Party is an internal group; the Chief Officer also advised that she would write to the Case Officer noting that the Town Council will hold an extraordinary meeting to discuss the appeal.

Councillor Johnson suggested writing to both the Welsh Government and PEDW to ask how are the public supposed to be able to comment on items of significance if the consultations are too technical. He added that a 90-day consultation period is not suitable considering the large amount of public interest.

Councillor Charles raised concerns in relation to the appeal and that the people of Barry need to win the fight with the development and also raised a concern over any compensation the company may request if their appeal isn't upheld.

84. **BUDGET MONITORING REPORT 31 AUGUST 2022**

Members were provided with a report outlining the Council's income and expenditure in the 2022/23 financial year as at the end of August 2022.

**RESOLVED: That the budget monitoring report to 31 August 2022 be received noting the actual income and expenditure up to the end of month five in the 2022/23 financial year, noting the projected overspend of £141,090 for 2022/23 that will result in a net amount of £182,943 being transferred from reserves.**

85. **ELECTION COSTS**

Members were provided with a report advising of the costs for the election held on 5 May 2022 that have been recharged from the Vale of Glamorgan Council and to consider the opportunity to pay the costs over two years.

Councillor Brooks asked if there was any prior warning in relation to the election costs. The Chief Officer advised that there was no prior warning received. Councillor Brooks suggested that a letter be sent expressing the Council's disappointment in relation to the notice

received as the costs are far higher than expected and has not helped in terms of budget planning for the Council.

Councillor S Hodges also expressed her disappointment in the increased costs for the election noting that the Vale of Glamorgan Council had not engaged with the Town Council and stating that the Town Council cannot go elsewhere for the service and that it is unethical how the charge has been calculated.

Councillor Johnson also expressed his disappointment stating that the costs have been split equally isn't true based on size and scale and that they have charged themselves less than the Town Council which may be an equal calculation but not equitable. Councillor Johnson suggested to contact Welsh Government Ministers and One Voice Wales as it is anti-democratic to charge the Town Council that amount for an election, which effectively falls to the tax payer to be able to participate in the democratic process.

- a. Barry Christmas Festival

Members were provided with a report updating them on the Festival of Light and Santa's Post Office events.

The Engagement and Events Team Manager advised members that the Vale of Glamorgan Council has requested that a small fee of £1.50 per family of four be implemented to help with running costs. The Engagement and Events Team Manager also advised that there will be a Christmas Festival rather than just the Santa's Post Office making it a more encompassing event culminating in the Council's Santa Fun Run, so ending with a Barry Town Council event.

There were a number of comments made by councillors requesting that given Barry Town Council's involvement and funding, this should be a Barry focused Programme with clear marketing and communications on the Town Council's role and support, so that this does not become absorbed as the Vale of Glamorgan Council's achievements, but working in partnership to deliver.

**RESOLVED: That Council receives the aforementioned information and authorises the Officer to begin liaising with the Vale of Glamorgan Council Events Team to deliver a successful Christmas Events programme on behalf of Barry Town Council.**

c. Mayors Chain Repairs

Members were provided with a report relating to the repairs required to the Mayor's Chain

**The Mayor left the room due to the previous declared interest as did Cllr Iannucci and, the Deputy Town Mayor covered the last item.**

b. Pride 2022

Members were provided with a report that provided further information regarding Pride 2022 and how Barry Town Council may wish to consider being involved with the event.

The Deputy Mayor advised that following a meeting of Finance, Policy and General Purposes Committee there was enough remaining Funding to award this as a Community Grant.

The report was dealt with via Urgent Action due to the timeline, but one of the items was not agreed unanimously, hence why it was brought to Full Council for decision. Councillor S Hodges noted that she was one of the Group Leaders who did not agree the Urgent Action as this was due to application being a joint venture with the Vale of Glamorgan Council and Councillor S Hodges was cautious to agree to funding not knowing what the Town Council was paying for; however, now that she had the specific information and detail of the funding requested, Councillor S Hodges was happy to support the application.

The Chief Officer also raised a query received by a member of the public in relation to the closure of Barry at War Museum and what Barry Town Council could do to assist. Members were happy to consider working in partnership as part of the Heritage Centre and the Chief Officer would arrange to meet to find out more.
