

things done to meet short term needs may have detrimental long term effect;

- (b) the need to take an integrated approach, by considering how —
 - (i) the body's well-being objectives may impact upon each of the well-being goals;
 - (ii) the body's well-being objectives impact upon each other or upon other public bodies' objectives, in particular where steps taken by the body may contribute to meeting one objective but may be detrimental to meeting another;
- (c) the importance of involving other persons with an interest in achieving the well-being goals and of ensuring those persons reflect the diversity of the population of the part of Wales in relation to which the body exercises functions;
- (d) how acting in collaboration with any other person (or how different parts of the body acting together) could assist the body to meet its well-being objectives, or assist another body to meet its objectives;
- (e) how deploying resources to prevent problems occurring or getting worse may contribute to meeting the body's well-being objectives, or another body's objectives.

RESOLVED: That the Well-being of Future Generations (Wales) Act 2015 be noted.

FREEDOM OF THE TOWN

The Mayor, Councillor Catherine Iannucci-Williams opened the meeting saying what an incredible honour it is to receive the Freedom of the Town and the two nominees have given an incredible contribution to the town.

a) Jane Hutt CBE MS

Councillor Bronwen Brooks nominated Jane Hutt, who was born in Epsom, Surrey. Her Welsh speaking grandparents were from North Wales and Jane herself is an active Welsh Learner.

Jane was one of the founder members of Welsh Women's Aid, a feminist organisation campaigning on behalf of women who are victims of domestic violence and she is the longest serving female Labour Minister in UK history.

Councillor Brooks is honoured to propose that Jane Hutt receives the Freedom of the Town.

Councillor Payne seconded the nomination.

Jane Hutt accepted the Freedom of the Town saying it was a real honour and she was thankful to her friends and colleagues.

A vote was taken on the nomination, and was unanimously agreed by all Councillors at the meeting.

b) Steffan Trefor Wiliam

Councillor Nic Hodges proposed that Steffan Trefor Wiliam receive Freedom of the Town for the continuous work he has done for the community of Barry.

Stefan himself was Mayor of Barry in 2021/2022 and is also a School Governor.

Councillor Ian Johnson seconded the nomination saying it's a real honour and only given to the select few with Steffan giving over 25 years of public service and has achieved theatrical status becoming an actor in theatre and film including Leaving Lenin

Steffan Wiliam accepted the Freedom of the Town saying it was of the highest privilege and a real honour and vowed to continue to serve the people of Barry going forward.

The Mayor reiterated that the Freedom of the Town is rarely given but both Jane Hutt and Steffan Wiliam are so worthy of the award and congratulated them both.

A vote was taken on the nomination, and was unanimously agreed by all Councillors at the meeting.
